
Introduction:


















Springhurst Habitat


















TEDxBellarmineU

The LEGO Design Internship

I have always enjoyed building with LEGO bricks. In high school, my dream was to one day go to work for the LEGO Group as a product designer.

This dream would be fulfilled from August – December 2018 as I had the honor of working in Billund, Denmark alongside Creator Expert designers whom I had admired since childhood.

Throughout my time in Denmark, I worked on product development, attended regular design board meetings, and assisted in many other internal affairs. Working full-time and being a college student gave me a taste of what an authentic work-world is like, and I thoroughly enjoyed it.







As I had to sign a non-disclosure agreement for my internship in Denmark, there are few projects I can talk about.

One exception is this "Wand of Creativity," built as a birthday present for a LEGO executive. This model was intentionally codesigned and co-built with my brick-mate, Mike Psiaki, a 'design master' at the LEGO Group.

The wand was intentionally designed to center around a red 2x4 LEGO brick, indicative of the LEGO Group's humble beginnings. The brick is at the center of the wand to symbolize the responsibility the executive bears while remaining true to the LEGO Group's core values of playing well and promoting creativity.


